

### Q2 How many of the world's 1-year-old children today have been vaccinated against some disease?





## Q3 How did the number of deaths per year from natural disasters change over the last hundred years?







# Q6 There are roughly seven billion people in the world today. Which map shows where people live? (Each figure represents 1 billion people.)










